We are particularly proud of our GDS (greater depth standard). In writing, like many other schools nationally, our results are below national. Writing will, therefore be on our School Development Plan for the next academic year. Well done Year 6 and teachers for all your hard work.

We have received lots of positive feedback with regards to our open afternoons, workshops, coffee mornings and other times when parents / carers have been able to come in to school. This is an important element of supporting the children and families to ensure that we make rapid progress back to becoming a 'Good' school once again. Parental engagement and support is a vital role in creating a 'Good' community school.

Thank you for your continued support—even when, at times, there has been change. We hope that you are starting to notice the positive changes and the impact these are having.
