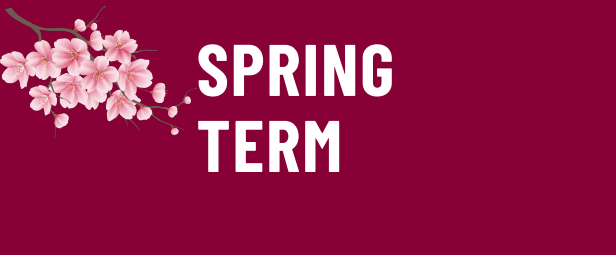

RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOL

»»» WHAT IS A RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOL?

There are four key areas of impact for children at a Rights Respecting school; wellbeing, participation, relationships and self-esteem.

The difference that a Rights Respecting School makes goes beyond the school gates, making a positive impact on the whole community.

- Children are healthier and happier
- Children feel safe
- Children have better relationships
- Children become active and involved in school life and the wider world

»»» THE STEER GROUP

'Rights Respecting Steering Group' is a group of children and adults who meet together weekly to discuss, plan and drive forward everything we do as a Rights Respecting School.

The UN convention consists of 54 articles in total, with each article referring to a right. UNICEF uses the UNCRC as a framework for its work for all the world's children and has developed the Rights Respecting School Award (RRSA). At Hatfeild the children learn about many of the rights through their involvement with UNICEF and a Rights Respecting ethos, throughout the whole school.

Some of the most important rights they learn are:

- Article 28: the right to an education;
- Article 27: the right to a home;
- Article 42: the right to know their rights;
- Article 31: the right to relax and play;
- Article 24: the right to nutritious food and clean water.



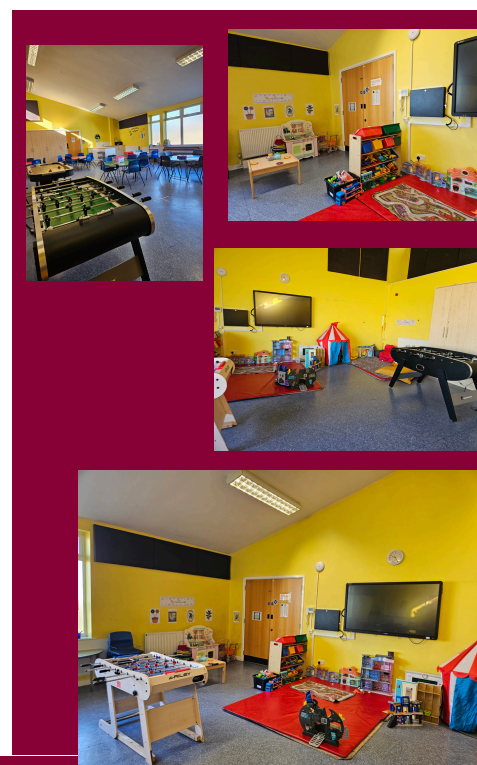
»»» AFTER SCHOOL CLUB
