# School Visits

# Homework

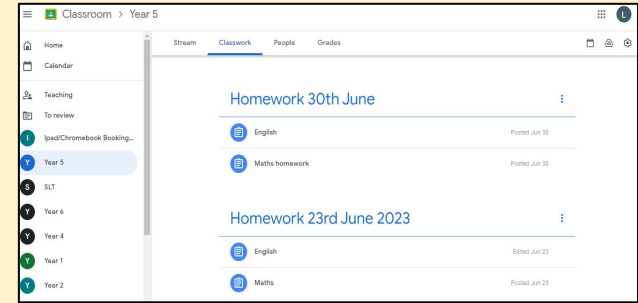
Every Friday your child's homework will be uploaded onto [Google Classroom](#).

We will aim to go through it with our class **on Friday afternoons and will be due in on the following Wednesday.**

If there are any problems or questions, please speak to your child/ children's class teacher.

Please remember homework should be a positive experience!

Your child will receive homework for English, Maths and Handwriting.



**Home reading** - Your child should be reading everyday. I know everyone has busy schedules, but ten or so minutes of reading before bed or in the morning is fine. Your child can record this in their Homework Diary if they read independently, but please sign to show you have also read with them or heard them read.

**Library** - We aim to visit the library every week (Thursday afternoons). Please ensure your child remembers to bring it in. If they have not finished reading the book, they may keep it until next time.

# Sensory Toys: School Guidelines



## Purpose of Sensory Toys

Sensory toys are valuable tools used to support children with specific sensory or emotional needs. They help with focus, regulation, and comfort—but only when used appropriately and intentionally.

## Who Receives Them

Teachers will identify children who may benefit from a sensory toy as part of their learning support.

- Parents may be asked to provide a suitable item
- Alternatively, the school may supply one

## Important Reminder

Please do not send sensory toys into school unless this has been discussed and agreed with your child's teacher. This ensures consistency, safety, and fairness for all children.

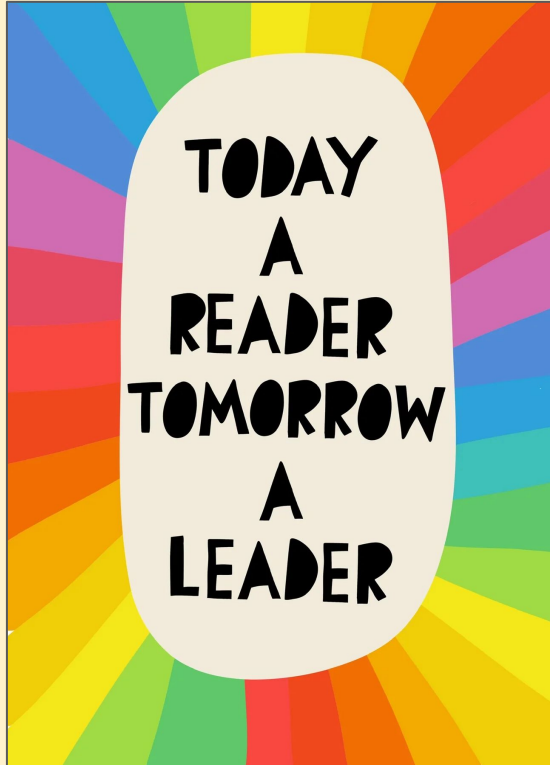

## Why should I read?



People who read are shown to have:

- Larger vocabulary.
- Better empathy skills.
- Better mental health.
- Increases your knowledge.
- Increase creativity.
- It's fun.

# Why should I read?

If you read for **20 minutes** every school day.

**3 900 minutes** in a year.

Equivalent **2  $\frac{3}{4}$  days** of reading!

**234 000 words** read in an academic year.

If you reads for **10 minutes** every school day!

**1 950 minutes** in a year.

Equivalent to **1  $\frac{1}{4}$  days** of reading!

**117 000 words** read in an academic year.



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## Anything else...
