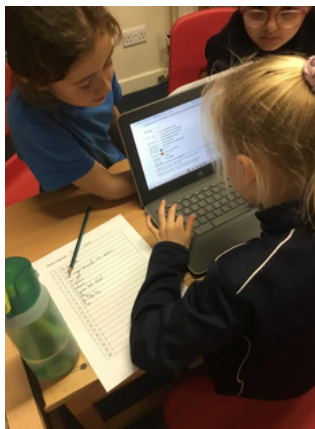

EDUCATIONAL VISITS

TRIPS >>>

Educational visits have enriched learning across the curriculum, providing pupils with opportunities to connect classroom concepts to real-world experiences. These excursions have sparked curiosity and deepened understanding.

- Year 6 explored the fascinating world of film and media at the Curzon Cinema and participated in a thrilling rap lesson during the MC Grammar World Record Attempt. These activities offered a dynamic look at media production and creative expression.
- Year 5 delved into scientific discovery at the Science Museum, where they engaged in hands-on activities that complemented their classroom learning. They also visited St Martin's Church, exploring its history and architecture, which tied into their studies about the Easter story.



- **Year 2** took an exciting journey through ecosystems at Morden Park, where they observed various habitats and learned about biodiversity. This trip enhanced their understanding of environmental science and geography.
- **Year 1** embarked on a historical adventure to Windsor Castle, learning about royal history and traditions. This visit provided a tangible connection to their studies of British history and cultural heritage.
- **Nursery** enjoyed a delightful visit to a local garden centre, where they explored plant life and growth, tying in with their theme of nature and change. They also learned about the Easter story during a church visit, enriching their understanding of cultural celebrations and storytelling.

These trips have not only extended pupils' knowledge but also encouraged them to view learning as an exciting, ongoing journey beyond the classroom walls.



This term has been packed with enrichment opportunities that have brought learning to life.

- **World Book Day** was a highlight, with pupils and staff dressing up as their favourite book characters or wearing pyjamas for a day of reading fun. Year 6 joined MC Grammar at the New Wimbledon Theatre for a record-breaking rap lesson, where 859 children from 18 schools took part in the largest rap lesson ever held.
- **Storyteller Wendy Shearer** visited to share African and Caribbean folktales, captivating pupils with her storytelling and inspiring them to create their own stories.
- **The London Mozart Players** performed for the school, introducing pupils to orchestral instruments and leading rhythm workshops with Year 4.
- **Science Week** encouraged curiosity and teamwork, with pupils conducting experiments, making predictions, and testing their ideas. Year 6 pupils supported younger classes, showing great leadership and enthusiasm.
- **These experiences** have helped pupils connect their classroom learning to the wider world and develop confidence, creativity, and curiosity.

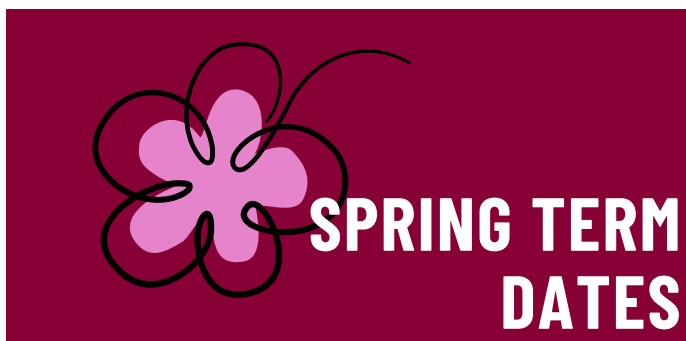
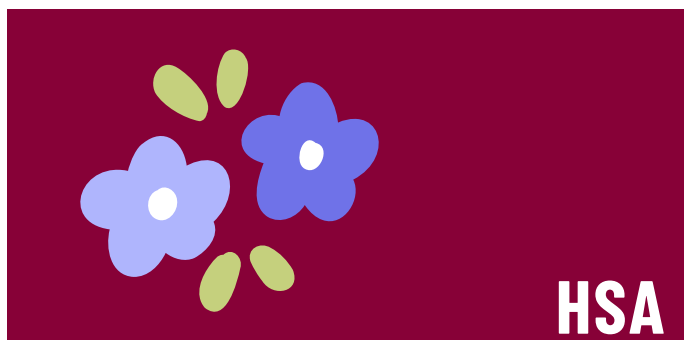


THANK YOU
