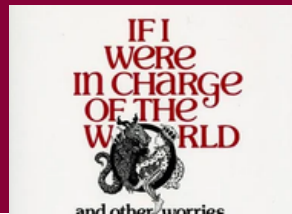
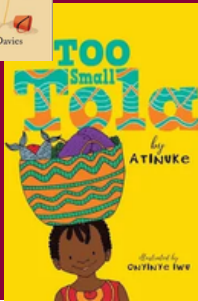
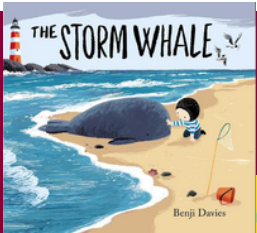
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English

This term in English, Year 2 pupils will continue to develop their sentence structure skills by using a range of coordinating and subordinating conjunctions to extend their ideas and add greater detail to their writing. Through a variety of engaging activities, the children will explore different writing forms, including instructional letters, narrative journeys, perspective writing, and poetry. To support and inspire their work, we will be studying a range of high-quality texts, including *The Storm Whale* by Benji Davies, *Too Small Tola* by Atinuke, *No, Nancy, No!*, and *If I Were in Charge of the World*. These texts will provide rich opportunities for discussion, creativity, and the development of vocabulary, helping pupils to build confidence and enjoyment in their writing.



Maths

This term in maths, Year 2 pupils will be exploring a range of topics to build their confidence and understanding. They will begin by learning about money, where they will recognise the different coins and notes, make amounts, and solve simple problems involving giving change. In fractions, children will learn to identify and find simple fractions of shapes and quantities, such as halves, quarters, and thirds.

When studying time, pupils will practise telling the time to the hour, half past, and quarter past/to, as well as understanding the sequence of events throughout the day. In position and direction, they will use mathematical language to describe movement and turns, including left, right, clockwise, and anticlockwise. Children will also revisit multiplication and division, focusing on times tables, grouping, and sharing to strengthen their recall and problem-solving skills. Finally, they will develop their understanding of measure by exploring capacity, volume, and mass, using practical activities to compare, measure, and solve real-life problems.



Topic

This term, our topics cover a range of exciting areas across the curriculum. In History, the children will explore what the seaside was like in the past, comparing it to seaside experiences today and learning about how holidays and traditions have changed over time.

In Geography, children will learn about the continents and oceans of the world, developing their understanding of global geography and locating these on maps and globes.

In RE, pupils will be introduced to Islam and Judaism, where they will learn about key beliefs, traditions, and important aspects of each religion.

In Science, the focus will be on plants, with children learning about how plants grow, what they need to survive, and identifying different types of plants in their environment.
